





How did the web work?

Federated versions of popular services like Facebook, Twitter and YouTube





No you've not!




Decentralised Louis XIV

Let's measure Mastodon!

- "Decentralised Twitter"
 - Around 4K servers (aka "instances")
 - 67M Mastodon "tweets"

 What pressures towards centralisation exist?



Let's go through a thought experiment...

Where would you host your server?!







Half of users are reliant on just 3 networks!

...and 2/3 of content

Which instance would you join?!

90% of users join top 5% of the instances




Top 5% of instances have 95% of content!




But at least decentralized == reliable?!

11% instances inaccessible for half of time




But at least decentralized == reliable?!

11% instances inaccessible for half of time ...still has central dependencies!




6 entire network outages




85% of instances use one Certificate Authority
